Website

Learning Logs

Outdoor Learning

Attendance

Please make sure that your child attends school every day unless he/she is ill. If your child is ill please telephone the office on the first day of absence. Punctuality is also very important because it helps to establish lifelong good habits, gets the day off to a good start for your child and prevents him/her missing out on information about the coming day.
